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Ecuador Amazon 6 Days All-inclusive Tour

During this trip to the Ecuadorian Amazon Rainforest, you will have the opportunity to discover the best of the three important nature reserves: Sumaco National Park, Limoncocha Biological Reserve and Yasuni National Park.

Sumaco National Park and Biosphere Reserve

On November 10 of 2000, UNESCO declared Sumaco – Napo – Galeras National Park and it surroundings Biosphere reserve, only granted to the most valuable cultural and natural protected areas.

There are three Biosphere Reserves on Ecuador's soil: Galapagos, Yasuni, and Sumaco; all part of a global network of Reserves, 380 in total and in 91 countries.

This Sumaco National Park is one of the less known and explored nature protected area in Ecuador, an ultimate frontier for Wilderness.

Limoncocha Biological Reserve

The reserve protects the lagoon mainly Limoncocha a smaller called Yanacocha, and wetlands, swamp and tropical rain forests that surround them. Limoncocha, especially its banks and marsh areas, home to a unique flora and fauna; adapted to living in permanent interaction water-forest.

Here we find a great diversity of species, especially waterfowl, which led to its declaration as a Ramsar site, an internationally recognized wetland of great importance.

Here is the only place in the Amazon of Ecuador, where you have the possibility to observe black alligators at very short distances and can measure up to 5 meters and more. At the corner of the lagoon, you will find a beautiful surprise, something you will never forget.

Yasuní National Park and Biosphere Reserve.

Yasuní, continental Ecuador's largest protected area, is host to impressive levels of biodiversity in the heat of the amazon tropical rain forest and protects part of the Waorani nationality territory. Species records demonstrate this biodiversity for various groups of flora and fauna, species never before registered in any other protected area. Here we find hundreds of tree species, wide rivers that overflow with the torrential rains, and large animals such as the jaguar, anaconda, and harpy eagle. We also find very small animals such as leoncillo or pocket monkey, the smallest primate in the world, and a great variety of reptiles and amphibians that make this park among the most bio-diverse in the world.

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How to get to Coca City by Plain?

The two airlines that fly from Quito to Coca are Aeroregional and LATAM. (30-minute flight and the ticket price cost around \$100 USD).

How to get to Loreto and Coca City by public bus?

There are comfortable buses every 2 hours that leave Quito, go through Loreto and arrive in Coca (Francisco de Orellana).

(6 hours bus ride and the price cost around \$15 USD).

How to Go from Coca City to Baños Town?

The buses to Baños town leave approximately every 2 hours.

Taxi: You can take a taxi or a private van from Quito to Coca for an approximate price of \$250 USD)

Basic description of the itinerary

Day 1

- > At 9 am, we start the tour from Loreto Town to Sumaco Biosphere Reserve.
- We will visit different areas with ancient fossils, caves and waterfalls.
- Shot hike.
- Stay the night in rustic lodge, comfortable place surrounded by nature.

Day 2

- Bird watching morning.
- Visit special trail to look for small bird and with luck we can see night birds sleeping.
- Visit a beautiful place in the jungle with 6 waterfall and rivers.

Day 3

- Travel in a private taxi to limoncocha biological reserve
- Accommodation in a comfortable local hotel.
- > Visit the big Limoncocha Lake in a motor canoe looking for monkeys, birds and others animals that live around the lake.
- Piranha fishing.
- > Night navigation looking for black caimans, frogs and others animals that are active at night.

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Day 4

- > Visit the left side of Limoncocha Lake.
- Jungle hike, learning about the different species that lives in the primary forest and secondary forest.
- After lunch, we continue the expedition, this time by boat 2 hours down Napo River to reach an Eco Lodge from an indigenous kichwa community.
- > Here we will stay the night in a comfortable private room.
- > Night walk looking for different creatures that are active during the night.

Day 5

- Breakfast.
- Hike to the top of a small hill, to reach a 45 meters high tower within Yasuni National Park, this tower allow you to enjoy the jungle from the canopy, appreciate the wildlife that habit high on top of the trees.
- Visit a parrot clay lick (salty minerals, where the animals go to eat everyday) located in the bank of the Napo River.
- Visit a Macaws and parakeets clay lick, located 30 minutes walking outside of the river within of Yasuní National Park.
- > Jungle Hike within Yasuni National Park.
- > Optional (visit a local indigenous kichwa families).

DAY 6

- > Jungle hike to a remote area, looking for birds, monkeys, plants, animals that lives around black water lagoons.
- Canoeing around the lagoon.
- After lunch, we have to pack everything, and take our boat to start coming back to Pompeya port, where our taxi will be waiting for us to bring us back to Coca City.
- > Around 5 pm, we will be in Coca City.
- > Here will be the end of our unforgettable tour.

IMPORTANT: The program and itinerary are subject to change to safeguard the safety of passengers, due to force majeure, unforeseen circumstances, negligence of third parties or bad weather.

We remind you that the activity of the animals also depends a lot on the climate.

The program includes:

Jungle Guide (English - Spanish) Local guides Comfortable hotel and lodges. Three meals a day during the tour and purified water 24 hours a day. Scheduled excursions Rubber boots (only up to number 45), Rain poncho. River and land transportation fallowing the tour programed.

Not Included

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Bus tickets. Alcoholic drinks Souvenirs & Personal Expenses Money back after the tour started. Travel and life Insurance Emergency expenses. Expenses not specified in the tour Sun block, mosquito repellent.

What to bring?

Passport, binoculars, flashlight, insect repellent, sun block, hat with wide brim, sunglasses, camouflage or dark clothes, lightweight long and short sleeved shirts, lightweight pants, swimsuit, comfortable shoes and long socks, Good Zoom camera, day pack. Picture of Yellow fever card (only if you have), Covid-19 vaccine card.




