

AMAZON RIVER EXPEDITION

Coca (Ecuador) → Iquitos (Peru) 4 Days / 3 Nights – Cross-Border Amazon Adventure

This is a once-in-a-lifetime Amazon River expedition traveling over 700 km from Coca, Ecuador to Iquitos, Peru along the legendary Napo River, crossing the heart of the Amazon rainforest entirely by boat.

This journey is designed for adventurous travelers seeking a true deep jungle experience, combining pristine rainforest, wildlife encounters, pink river dolphins, indigenous river communities, and an official international border crossing between Ecuador and Peru.

It is one of the few river expeditions in South America where travelers can cross two countries entirely by water, navigating through protected rainforest zones and some of the most remote river corridors on Earth.

WHY THIS EXPEDITION IS UNIQUE

- Cross the Amazon rainforest from Ecuador to Peru entirely by river
- Navigate through Yasuní National Park, one of the most biodiverse places on Earth
- Experience remote Amazon river life far from roads and cities
- Witness pink river dolphins in their natural habitat
- Arrive in Iquitos, the largest city in the world with no road access

ITINERARY

DAY 1 – Coca → Nuevo Rocafuerte | Deep Amazon River Journey Begins

The expedition begins in El Coca (Puerto Francisco de Orellana), gateway to the Ecuadorian Amazon.

- 7.30 am morning departure by authorized speedboat along the Napo River
- Navigation through primary rainforest and Amazon river communities
- Wildlife viewing along riverbanks
- Arrival in Nuevo Rocafuerte (last Ecuadorian town near the border)
- Lunch at local restaurant
- Assistance with Ecuador immigration exit procedures
- Overnight stay in local Amazon lodge/hotel

This day introduces the scale and raw beauty of the Amazon River ecosystem.

DAY 2 – Yasuní National Park | Wildlife & Pink Dolphin Territory

Early departure by motorized canoe into Yasuní National Park, one of the most biodiverse places on Earth.

- Exploration of rainforest rivers and lagoons
- Navigation toward Cocaya region (pink river dolphins)
- Wildlife observation: with luck we can watch monkeys, macaws, toucans, river birds
- Jungle exploration in pristine rainforest
- Continued navigation toward the Ecuador–Peru border
- Official river crossing into Peru
- Arrival in Cabo Pantoja
- Immigration procedures, dinner, and overnight stay

This is the most iconic wildlife and border-crossing day of the expedition.

DAY 3 – Cabo Pantoja → Santa Clotilde | Deep Peruvian Amazon Expedition

Early morning departure (04:30–05:00 AM) by semi-speed river boat.

- Full-day navigation through remote Amazon rainforest
- Journey through untouched river corridors
- Observation of traditional river life
- Deep immersion in Amazon wilderness
- Arrival in Santa Clotilde in the afternoon
- Dinner and overnight stay in local lodge

One of the most remote and authentic Amazon river experiences in South America.

DAY 4 – Santa Clotilde → Iquitos | Arrival on the Amazon River

Early departure toward final destination.

- Boat transfer to Puerto Mazán
- Short overland transfer to Indiana
- Final navigation along the Amazon River
- Arrival in Iquitos around midday (subject to river conditions)

Arriving in Iquitos by boat is a unique experience, as it is the largest city in the world without road access.

End of expedition.

! IMPORTANT NOTES

- Valid passport required for Ecuador–Peru border crossing
- Accommodation is basic, clean, and suitable for remote Amazon areas
- Early departures required on Days 3 and 4 due to river schedules
- Travel times may vary due to weather and river conditions
- Strongly recommended to purchase travel insurance
- Expedition operates in remote Amazon conditions
